Engineered Hardwood Flooring Care Guide

Routine Maintenance

- Frequent Dust Removal: Dust mop or vacuum daily in high-traffic areas using a microfiber mop or a vacuum with the beater bar off. Reach into corners and under furniture.
- Gentle Technique: Use gentle strokes when sweeping or mopping to avoid pressing debris into beveled edges.
- Wiping Spills Promptly: Blot spills immediately with a soft cloth to prevent moisture damage.
- Maintain Floor Finish: Use pH-neutral, residue-free cleaners to preserve the finish.

Spill & Stain Handling

- Immediate Spill Response: Blot liquids promptly to prevent seeping into seams or staining the wood veneer.
- Scuff Marks: Rub with a dry soft cloth or a tennis ball. Use non-scratch scuff remover pads if needed.
- Sticky Residue: Use mineral spirits on a cloth to dissolve adhesive, followed by a wood floor cleaner.
- Pet Accidents: Clean urine immediately with a vinegar solution, followed by a water wipe and drying.

Deep Cleaning

- Periodic Deep Cleaning: Deep clean every few months with a damp mop and a stronger wood floor cleaner or vinegar-water solution. Dry immediately.
- Be Mindful of Finish Types: Use appropriate cleaners for polyurethane or oil-finished floors.

Climate & Environmental Considerations

- Temperature and Humidity Stability: Maintain 60-80°F and 35-55% relative humidity to prevent swelling or gapping.
- Air Conditioning and Ventilation: Ensure good air movement to prevent stagnant humid air.
- Chemicals in Environment: Protect floors from paint splatters or chemical overspray during home projects.

Preventive Care Strategies

- Furniture Protection: Use felt pads or soft rubber wheels on furniture. Lift, don't drag, heavy items.
- Spill Containment: Use rugs in spill-prone areas like kitchens or entries.
- Protect from Sunlight: Use window coverings to prevent UV damage and overheating.

Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Using Too Much Water: Avoid wet mopping or steam mops, which can damage the finish or wood.
- Ignoring Environmental Control: Maintain stable humidity and temperature to prevent gapping or cupping.
- Over-cleaning or Wrong Polishing: Use cleaners sparingly and avoid excessive polish buildup.

Additional Tips

- Dealing with Squeaks: Lubricate squeaky seams with talcum powder or consult a professional.
- Odor Removal: Use baking soda or wood-safe enzymatic cleaners for persistent odors.
- Winter Care: Mop up salt residue promptly to prevent scratching or chemical damage.
- Summer Tips: Maintain moderate humidity to prevent swelling.
